Specific Area of Learning Understanding the World	 Know some similarities and differences between different religious and cultural communities in this country, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class. Explain some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries, drawing on knowledge from stories, non-fiction texts, and when appropriate, maps. 	 From Spring Term daily collective worship – with opportunities to listen to stories from the bible and Christian hymns and music. Explicit links are made to Christianity from around the world. Sharing stores that reflect diversity of experiences. (e.g The stories 'Smeds and Smoos' and 'Mixed') Exploration of key Christian events eg Nativity, Advent, Harvest, Easter and Pentecost. Exploration of key religious events from other faiths eg Eid and Diwali. Inclusion of small world characters and puppets from different faiths and cultures. Visit in Reception to St Michael's Church. Following of Sandwell RE scheme and Understanding Christianity. Exploration of school values in circle time.
