- 2. Unconditional Love and Compassion: Despite the wandering of the sheep, the shepherd doesn't give up on it. This symbolises the hope that no matter how lost or far someone may feel, there's always a chance for redemption and reconciliation.
- 3. Joy in Restoration: The shepherd's joy upon finding the lost sheep reflects the joy in restoration. It highlights the hope that there is immense joy in spiritual or personal restoration, emphasising the possibility of change and renewal.

Overall, the parable offers hope by emphasising the value of every individual, the unwavering love and compassion of a higher power, and the joy in redemption and restoration.

Bad Weather Conditions

The whole school's attendance target is 96%. The whole school attendance for the year so far is **94.2%**. Unfortunately, our persistent absence is **18.4%**. Please ensure your child comes to school every day.

So far this academic year, we have had 16 families taking unauthorised leave in term time (holidays). This has resulted in £2932 in fixed penalty notices issued by Birmingham City Council. We ask that families do not take leave in term time as these will not be authorised by school.



Birmingham Public Health

Birmingham Public Health have asked if all schools can pass on the following message.

They are encouraing that all parents and carers check that their child has been vaccinated. Parents can check the personal child health record (the Red Book) or if this doesn't help, speak to their GP surgery.

Parents can contact their GP surgery to catch their child up, at any age, or indeed, for themselves.

Measles is highly infectious (it can spread easily from person to person). While most people recover completely within a couple of weeks, measles can cause serious illness and in rare cases it can be fatal. Vaccination with two doses of MMR is the only way to give people maximum protection.

The first signs of measles are:

- high temperature
- runny or blocked nose
 - sneezing
 - cough
- red, sore, watery eyes
- rash usually appears a few days after cold-like symptoms (sometimes starts around the ears before spreading to rest of the body)

Measles can cause complications, especially in certain at-risk groups that include babies and small children, pregnant women and people with weak immunity.

Further important information

The MMR vaccine

If your child has not received two doses of MMR vaccination as part of their childhood immunisation programme, you should take up the offer of the MMR vaccine for your child now. If you are not sure if your child needs an MMR vaccine, you can contact your GP to check.

The MMR vaccination is the best way to protect against measles as it is:

- effective
- safe and
- free of charge

The vaccine provides effective protection against three diseases – measles, mumps and rubella. The first dose of MMR is given soon after the first birthday. A second dose is normally given before school entry.

However, you can have the MMR vaccine at any age. If either you or your child are not fully protected against measles (two doses of MMR), you can contact your GP surgery to arrange vaccination. It is never too late to get vaccinated. Two doses of MMR are required to produce satisfactory protection against measles, mumps and rubella. If your family avoids pork, a MMR vaccine is available that does not contain any pork products.

This is especially important when measles is circulating because any child or adult who has not had at least one dose of MMR and comes into contact with a person with measles will have to be excluded from nursery, school or work for 21 days and stay at home.

What to do if you think your child has measles

If your child develops symptoms, you should contact your GP. You must contact the surgery by telephone before visiting and tell the reception staff that you think that your child may have measles and not attend the surgery unless you are asked to. The doctor will make special arrangements to see your child so that, if they have measles, they won't pass it to others.

People with measles will remain infectious, and so be able to pass on the disease to others for 4 days after the start of the rash. Therefore, it is important that anyone with measles stays away from nursery, school, group activities, gatherings or anywhere with people outside of the household during that time.

What is happening in the classroom?

Nursery

On Monday this week, the children blew everyone away with their amazing Christmas singing! They were fantastic! Miss Coe and the adults in nursery are so proud of all the children for their brilliant performance! Thank you to all adults who attended, we hope you enjoyed our show.

The children have enjoyed more Christmas activities this week. They have been filling stockings with presents, making calendars and baubles and have joined in reading the nativity story with actions! We have also watched Stickman; a story which the children love because Santa helps our hero to find his way home!

In phonics this week, we were introduced to initial sounds and we began by listening to and identifying the first sound in our names. And in Maths we have been looking at length and height; comparing the length of objects and seeing who is the tallest in our class!

Reception

RG

This week RG have been learning more about the Nativity story. We have also had a busy week practicing our Nativity play ready for our performances next week.

RS

This week RS have been learning about shapes. They have been exploring the properties of triangles, squares, rectangle and circles and comparing them. They also had lots of fun playing shape bingo.

Year 1

1F

This week in English the children have been writing their own story. The children have learned about plurals, suffixes and nouns and are now applying them to their writing. In maths the children have been using number lines to 20 and also finding one more and one less. This week the children have also practiced their handwriting by writing their own letter to Santa. We then took a trip to post the letters in the post box next to Santa's grotto. The children were very excited and hoping their letters get to Santa very soon.

1M

In Year 1 this week, the children have been super at using a number line to 20. They have been finding one more and one less. They have also been using numicon to represent 20 in different ways. We also answered our big question in History which was how have toys changed over time? They came up with some super sentences and had lots of interesting facts.

2K

Children answered their Big Question 'Does everything shiny conduct electricity?' by using their scientific skills to test a variety of material to classify them as conductors or insulators.

During maths lessons, 4R have been using their reasoning and problem .solving skills to help them multiply by one and zero. In history, we are beginning to come to the end of our topic, the Romans. We will be applying this knowledge to answer our big question next week

6L


Another busy week in Year 6 and again, we are so proud of them! Their recent SATs scores have shown amazing progress and they have shown brilliant attitudes once again.

What you need to bring to school

A reminder of what to bring to school:

✓ A water bottle (please make sure it has yourname on it). This should only have water in it and have a pop up top (not a screw top as if these fall over on the desks, they will ruin the children's work).

✓ A school bag or bookbag.

- √ A healthy fruit snack for breaktime (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with this).
- \checkmark You can bring your scooter or bike to school if you wish. Please remember to wear a helmet and not to ride them whilst on school grounds.

X As always, please remember not to bring in any toys or stationery from home, unless it has been specifically requested by your teacher.

X No non-prescribed medication. Any medication that has been prescribed must be handed by the parent/carer to the school office staff who will ask you to complete a medication form detailing-permission and dosage.

Medical and Dietary Information

It is very important that we have up-to-date medical information including new Care Plans so we will be sending these out for you to review, complete and return. Any other updated health information should be sent in via the school office.

Please remember to inform the school of any changes to your child's medical or dietary needs.

Please also ensure that any prescribed medication, including an inhaler or EpiPen, is in-date and in school
- it is parents responsibility to ensure this.

Free School Meals, Toast and Price Changes

All children in Year's Reception - Year 2 are entitled to a 'Universal Free School Meal'.

When a child enters Year 3 this entitlement ends. If you would like your child to receive a school dinner your will need to:

- Check you eligibility for a FSM here: <u>Online FSM Application (cloudforedu.org.uk)</u> School will be notified of the outcome of your application and proceed accordingly.
- Top up your 'School Food United' account to ensure there are funds to pay for your child's meals.

 The price for a school meal for the academic year 23/24 is £2.80 per day. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.
 - We will no longer be accepting cash for toast, this will also need to be ordered each down through 'School Food United' The cost per day is 25p. Children will receive their toast at their break time between around 10.30am. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.

• We sent out guidance of how to create/use your 'School Food United' app via Arbor last week - if you require any further assistance please speak to a member of the school office.

Birthdays

Natasha's Law came into effect on 1st October 2021. We appreciate that there may be some special times throughout the year when children may wish to bring sweets or chocolate in to share with their friends (e.g birthdays), please may we ask that children only bring in prepacked sweets such as Haribos which can then be handed out at the end of the day before children go and see their parents or guardians. Please understand that we cannot accept any homemade or individual sweets as this will not comply with Natasha's Law or current allergen requirements.

Nut Free School

A reminder that the school is a nut-free zone as several children and members of staff have severe nut allergies. Please make sure that no nuts are brought to school and please check the ingredients on packets carefully. Thank you for helping us to keep all our community safe.

School Uniform

- White polo shirt (with/without logo).
- Red sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without logo).
 - Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore.
 - Red and white check dress (summer).
 - Grey or black shorts (summer).
 - Black shoes.





P.E Uniform

- Red or black shorts.
- White t-shirt (with or without the school logo).
 - Black bumps/trainers.
- Black tracksuit bottoms for outdoor games in winter.

Pumps are needed for indoor PE and must come in a separate bag for children to change into for the lesson. Trainers are not to be worn inside. Please make sure that your child has a pair of pumps onsite in case the weather means we need to do P.E inside.

You can also purchase a hoodie with the school logo on for P.E. from the office. This is not compulsory.



Labelling

We understand how much a new uniform and school items cost and we try our best to ensure the children look after their clothing and bags. Please label your child's clothing, bags, lunch boxes, shoes and water bottles to help us return lost items to their owner.
