Bad Weather Conditions

Should the weather be severe at any point through winter, we will let you know of any closures through Arbor communications.

As we are entering the winter months, I wanted to make you aware of the arrangements for if we are unable to open as a result of weather conditions. We will only do this as a last resort where we think

there is a risk to the safety of pupils and staff. We have some staff who travel a long way and at times it may be unsafe for them to do so.

Please also be aware that as the snow often arrives between 7am and 9am, we may be in a position to open later in the morning when the air begins to warm slightly.

The whole school's attendance target is 96%. The whole school attendance for the year so far is **94.5%**. Unfortunately, our persistent absence is **15.5%**. Please ensure your child comes to school every day.

So far this academic year, we have had 16 families taking unauthorised leave in term time (holidays). This has resulted in £2932 in fixed penalty notices issued by Birmingham City Council. We ask that families do not take leave in term time as these will not be authorised by school.



What is happening in the classroom?

Nursery

This week the Nursery children have said "Goodbye" to Autumn and "Hello" to Winter. We raced Ice penguins down the bamboo chutes, made marks in 'flour snow' using different paint brushes, made salt dough christmas decorations, looked at what clothes we will need in the cold weather and read our new story of the week; The Snowman. We were introduced to the idea of 'Helicopter stories', an activity which allows the children to act out favourite stories and we all got involved in the re-telling of The Snowman. The children also seem very excited about the build up to Christmas and have been enthusiastically practising our Christmas songs. You may have heard them singing at home as there are some very catchy

tunes!

Reception

RG

This week RG have started a new story in Literacy called Star in a Jar. We have read the book and discussed the items of treasure from it. In Maths this week we have been learning to subitise numbers 1 to 5 using the standard dice arrangements.

RS

This week RS have been learning about celebrations. They have been discussing things we celebrate and why we celebrate them. They have been using their fine motor skills to cut and stick, creating their own class bunting and using their gross motor skills outside to paint lights on a string using paintbrushes on long sticks.

Year 1

1F - This week in English, the children have been introduced to the story of Rapunzel. The children were given the book cover and had to predict what they thought might happen. The imagination from the children was amazing.

In DT this week the children have designed their own smoothies. They learned all about where fruits and vegetables grow and what fruits they would include in their own smoothie. in addition to tasting a range of fruits and making their own smoothie, they also designed their own packaging for it. Dragons Den, here we come!

1M

The children has a fantastic day on Tuesday when we had our DT day. We looked at where fruit and vegetables come from and then we made our own tasty smoothies. They all worked really hard and had a fun day.

Year 2

2K

This week in 2K we have been trying very hard with addition and subtraction. We have even started to add and subtract 2 digit numbers crossing over 10. We are still finding this a little bit tricky but we will get there with lots of practise. In English we have been continuing with 'The Night Gardener' and we are learning lots of skills to enable us to write a diary.

2R

In 2R this week we have been trying really hard in Maths adding 2-digit numbers crossing 10. We have also been exploring The Great Fire of London, where we discussed the differences and similarities in life in 1666 compared to life now.

3D

This week, the children have been practicing their roles for the Year 3 Hanukkah assembly. This included certain children reading their lines about what Hannukah is and how Jewish people celebrate this as well as learning a song which we will be sung during the assembly.

3T

In Maths this week, 3T have worked super hard dividing by 4. They have been solving reasoning problems, making sure that they show their working out. In English, we have been learning about fables. The texts we have been learning about, have had the moral - never trust a stranger. In RE, we have created a fact file all about Ramadan. I have been really impressed with the work we have been producing. Well done 3T!

Year 4

4J

During this weeks lesson 4J have been very focused! During Handball lessons, children were practising their penalty throws using a one handed arm throw. Children have been writing the narrative in English lessons where we have included the skills we have explored over the past few weeks. During Maths, we have found our seven Times Tables tricky this week please continue to practice at home.

4R

In this weeks, lessons, 4R have been working really hard to finish off our outsider narratives in writing and have wasted no time in starting their next unit of writing. We have continued our work with multiplication in maths, beginning to learn our seven times tables. In science, we have been planning our experiment for next week where we will be testing what materials conduct electricity.

Year 5

5H

This week we have been looking at equivalent fractions. The children have looked at different ways of finding equivalent fractions and how to compare them. During English, we have used different prefixes in our writing and have begun to look at the structure of letters. We have looked at maps of Bartley Green and compared them with an area of France to help us understand why people choose to live in different places.

5F

This week, in Maths, we have been continuing with our fraction work. Our focus this week is equivalent fractions, which involves finding a common denominator. During English, we have used different prefixes in our writing and have begun to look at the structure and varying language used in letters. In PHSE, we have looked at bullying, what it involves and how we can deal appropriately with it if it arises. As well as this, we have been continuing to learn and rehearse our Christmas production in preparation for rehearsals next week.

Year 6

6H

What another busy week! Thank you so much to the parents who came to look at their children's work on Tuesday - you should be so proud of everything they have achieved so far... I know I am!


This week, 6H, have been exploring the importance of VE Day and making Propaganda posters to advertise this key event. We have also been carefully looking after our 'home-made' fossils and increasing the weight, in line with the sediment weight ... who knew sweets and stale bread would develop such a discussion in our science lesson! Finally, we have been moving on to long division - keep going Year 6, not the easiest of mathematical concepts but well done for all your hard work and determination!

Wow, 6L have been continuing their amazing work in the classroom and we are so proud of their fantastic learning. In History, we have created Propaganda posters to advertise VE Day (Victory in Europe). The children have been loving our new book that we have explored in writing - A Story Like the Wind. They have explored expanded noun phrases, similes and antonyms and new vocabulary in preparation for writing their own flashback story. Keep up the super work!

What you need to bring to school

A reminder of what to bring to school:

✓ A water bottle (please make sure it has yourname on it). This should only have water in it and have a pop up top (not a screw top as if these fall over on the desks, they will ruin the children's work).

√A school bag or bookbag.

✓ A healthy fruit snack for breaktime (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with this).

✓ You can bring your scooter or bike to school if you wish. Please remember to wear a helmet and not to ride them whilst on school grounds.

X As always, please remember not to bring in any toys or stationery from home, unless it has been specifically requested by your teacher.

X No non-prescribed medication. Any medication that has been prescribed must be handed by the parent/carer to the school office staff who will ask you to complete a medication form detailing-permission and dosage.

Medical and Dietary Information

It is very important that we have up-to-date medical information including new Care Plans so we will be sending these out for you to review, complete and return. Any other updated health information should be sent in via the school office.

Please remember to inform the school of any changes to your child's medical or dietary needs.

Please also ensure that any prescribed medication, including an inhaler or EpiPen, is in-date and in school
- it is parents responsibility to ensure this.

Free School Meals, Toast and Price Changes

When a child enters Year 3 this entitlement ends. If you would like your child to receive a school dinner your will need to:

- Check you eligibility for a FSM here: <u>Online FSM Application (cloudforedu.org.uk)</u> School will be notified of the outcome of your application and proceed accordingly.
- Top up your 'School Food United' account to ensure there are funds to pay for your child's meals.

 The price for a school meal for the academic year 23/24 is £2.80 per day. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.
 - We will no longer be accepting cash for toast, this will also need to be ordered each down through 'School Food United' The cost per day is 25p. Children will receive their toast at their break time between around 10.30am. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.
- We sent out guidance of how to create/use your 'School Food United' app via Arbor last week if you require any further assistance please speak to a member of the school office.

Birthdays

Natasha's Law came into effect on 1st October 2021. We appreciate that there may be some special times throughout the year when children may wish to bring sweets or chocolate in to share with their friends (e.g birthdays), please may we ask that children only bring in prepacked sweets such as Haribos which can then be handed out at the end of the day before children go and see their parents or guardians. Please understand that we cannot accept any homemade or individual sweets as this will not comply with Natasha's Law or current allergen requirements.

Nut Free School

A reminder that the school is a nut-free zone as several children and members of staff have severe nut allergies. Please make sure that no nuts are brought to school and please check the ingredients on packets carefully. Thank you for helping us to keep all our community safe.

School Uniform

- White polo shirt (with/without logo).
- Red sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without logo).
 - Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore.
 - Red and white check dress (summer).
 - Grey or black shorts (summer).
 - Black shoes.





P.E Uniform

- Red or black shorts.
- White t-shirt (with or without the school logo).
 - Black bumps/trainers.
- Black tracksuit bottoms for outdoor games in winter.

Pumps are needed for indoor PE and must come in a separate bag for children to change into for the lesson. Trainers are not to be worn inside. Please make sure that your child has a pair of pumps onsite in case the weather means we need to do P.E inside.

You can also purchase a hoodie with the school logo on for P.E. from the office. This is not compulsory.



Labelling

We understand how much a new uniform and school items cost and we try our best to ensure the children look after their clothing and bags. Please label your child's clothing, bags, lunch boxes, shoes and water bottles to help us return lost items to their owner.
