

What is happening in the classroom?

Nursery

This week in Nursery, the children have learnt about Jungle animals. We found out the names of some well known jungle creatures and matched them to their babies. We used the magnifying glasses to look more closely at jungle minibeasts, played with jungle swamp slime, and explored real exotic fruits by looking at the shapes and colours, touching and smelling them. We have also touched on the important message about looking after our rainforests and rainforest animals. The children have enjoyed listening to our jungle stories with "Little Monkey" being this week's favourite. We are also becoming accomplished at orally blending words as the children practise daily in our phonics lessons.

Reception

RG

This week in Literacy Reception have been learning about the structure of instructions based on how to catch the wolf in Little Red riding hood. In Understanding the World the children have been learning about different types of weather and we have made a weather chart over the week.

RS

In Maths Reception have been learning about representations of numbers to 10 and how these can be composed and decomposed. You could explore this at home by using household items to show different amounts. Show us on tapestry if you do!

1F

This week in maths, the children have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. The children then used resources to make groups of each number and the total amount. In DT the children have not only designed a moving vehicle, they have made it too. Thank you to all parents that sent in boxes for this lesson.

In Year 1 this week, we have been writing a set of instructions on how to catch a witch. They have been super with their sentences and have came up with lots of imaginitive ideas. We have also designed our own moving vehicle this week in DT and the children are really excited to make them.

Year 2

2K

This week we have continued learning about Multiplication and Division in Maths. We are focusing on Multiplying and dividing by 2. In English we have started to write our own story based on Grandad's Island. In Geography we have been learning about different climates across the world and in Science we have started a plant experiment to see what helps plants to grow.

2R

This week the children have worked SUPER hard in our topic of Multiplication and Division. Although its been tricky the children have really persevered and done their best. In English this week the children have started writing their own version of Grandad's Island and its been great hearing so many wonderful ideas shared across classes. The children have also loved PSHE this week where we focused on the importance of mindfulness and enjoyed a colouring session while discussing what we can do more of to be relaxed.

Year 3

3D

This week in Maths, the children have been working hard on our new topic which is fractions. In English, the children been planning a return narrative based on our book 'Jemmy Button' ready to write their own narrative description next week.

In Geography, we learnt about the five major types of biomes, we looked at the physical features, vegetation and animals in each one. In Science, we looked at different food labels to see how to identify whether something has the right nutrients in to help us have a balanced diet. In Art we used different paints to create tones on our chosen picture.

Year 4

4J

4J have had a busy week! At the start of the week, children were tested on how much progress they had made with their Multiplication Check. Children have been working hard to boost up their scores and those children who have been accessing Times Table Rockstars at home have made considerable progress! They have also been learning about the Ancient Greeks and how they fit in the timeline. During reading lesson, children have been looking at their vocabulary and how they could make it more ambitious.

4R

At the start of the week, each of the children were tested on how much progress they have made in preparation for the Multiplication Tables Check using TT Rockstars to practice and check their scores. They have also been continuing their work on the Ancient Greeks by comparing them to the Ancient Egyptians, focussing on their architecture. We have continued to develop our knowledge of twisted tales in our writing lessons.

Year 5

5H

During English this week we have been using synonyms to develop our writing. We have been practicing our timetables to help us in all areas of maths and we have worked hard to develop the speed of our recall. In Science, we have learnt about different animal groups and sorted animals into the correct groups. We have also made common craft videos to teach other children about Earth in Space.

This week we have been working extremely hard with fractions, decimals and converting between the both. In English, we have written our atmosphere description piece, focussing on the use of synonyms, verb prefixes and relative clauses. As well as this, we have learnt about different animal groups, their life cycles and how they differ. In History, we have moved on to the Vikings and the similarities and differences they share with the Anglo-Saxons.

Year 6

Year 6

It has been another great week in Year 6 and we are once again so impressed with their learning. In RE, we have been exploring the question: What kind of a king was Jesus? We have used two parables to think carefully about this and have made links in discussion to our own lives and communities. In English, we have been continuing our documentary narrative in which the children have been writing in the style of David Attenborough. The children have been continuing their geography learning about North America and have found out about the imports, exports and human features of California. Well done Year 6!

Measles

As you may be aware, across Birmingham there has been an outbreak of measles. Please read the following information which has been issued:


- There's no specific medical treatment for measles, so it's important to get vaccinated as it's the best protection against becoming seriously unwell.
 - Measles usually starts with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash a few days later.
- You should ask for an urgent GP appointment or get help from NHS 111 if you think you or your child may have measles.
 - Don't go to the GP or any other healthcare setting without calling them first.

- If your child has been diagnosed with measles by a doctor, they should stay off nursery or school for at least 4 days from when the rash first appears. They should also avoid close contact with babies and anyone who is pregnant or has a weakened immune system.
 - Parents can book a free vaccine through the GP but if a child has already been vaccinated it is
 very unlikely that they have measles. 'It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or
 common cold, provided they don't have a temperature'. The incubation period is the length of
 time it can take to develop the illness after being in contact with someone with measles. For
 measles, the incubation period can be up to 21 days.

What you need to bring to school

A reminder of what to bring to school:

✓ A water bottle (please make sure it has yourname on it). This should only have water in it and have a pop up top (not a screw top as if these fall over on the desks, they will ruin the children's work).

✓ A school bag or bookbag.

- √ A healthy fruit snack for breaktime (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with this).
- \checkmark You can bring your scooter or bike to school if you wish. Please remember to wear a helmet and not to ride them whilst on school grounds.

X As always, please remember not to bring in any toys or stationery from home, unless it has been specifically requested by your teacher.

X No non-prescribed medication. Any medication that has been prescribed must be handed by the parent/carer to the school office staff who will ask you to complete a medication form detailing-permission and dosage.

Medical and Dietary Information

It is very important that we have up-to-date medical information including new Care Plans so we will be sending these out for you to review, complete and return. Any other updated health information should be sent in via the school office.

Please remember to inform the school of any changes to your child's medical or dietary needs.

Please also ensure that any prescribed medication, including an inhaler or EpiPen, is in-date and in school
- it is parents responsibility to ensure this.

Free School Meals, Toast and Price Changes

All children in Year's Reception - Year 2 are entitled to a 'Universal Free School Meal'.

When a child enters Year 3 this entitlement ends. If you would like your child to receive a school dinner your will need to:

- Check you eligibility for a FSM here: <u>Online FSM Application (cloudforedu.org.uk)</u> School will be notified of the outcome of your application and proceed accordingly.
- Top up your 'School Food United' account to ensure there are funds to pay for your child's meals.

 The price for a school meal for the academic year 23/24 is £2.80 per day. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.
 - We will no longer be accepting cash for toast, this will also need to be ordered each down through 'School Food United' The cost per day is 25p. Children will receive their toast at their break time between around 10.30am. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.

• We sent out guidance of how to create/use your 'School Food United' app via Arbor last week - if you require any further assistance please speak to a member of the school office.

Birthdays

Natasha's Law came into effect on 1st October 2021. We appreciate that there may be some special times throughout the year when children may wish to bring sweets or chocolate in to share with their friends (e.g birthdays), please may we ask that children only bring in prepacked sweets such as Haribos which can then be handed out at the end of the day before children go and see their parents or guardians. Please understand that we cannot accept any homemade or individual sweets as this will not comply with Natasha's Law or current allergen requirements.

Nut Free School

A reminder that the school is a nut-free zone as several children and members of staff have severe nut allergies. Please make sure that no nuts are brought to school and please check the ingredients on packets carefully. Thank you for helping us to keep all our community safe.

School Uniform

- White polo shirt (with/without logo).
- Red sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without logo).
 - Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore.
 - Red and white check dress (summer).
 - Grey or black shorts (summer).
 - Black shoes.





P.E Uniform

- Red or black shorts.
- White t-shirt (with or without the school logo).
 - Black bumps/trainers.
- Black tracksuit bottoms for outdoor games in winter.

Pumps are needed for indoor PE and must come in a separate bag for children to change into for the lesson. Trainers are not to be worn inside. Please make sure that your child has a pair of pumps onsite in case the weather means we need to do P.E inside.

You can also purchase a hoodie with the school logo on for P.E. from the office. This is not compulsory.



Labelling

We understand how much a new uniform and school items cost and we try our best to ensure the children look after their clothing and bags. Please label your child's clothing, bags, lunch boxes, shoes and water bottles to help us return lost items to their owner.
