Nursery Places

We currently have places available in our nursery class.

Our nursery caters for children ages 3-4 years old.

Children can start our nursery, the term after they are 3. So if your child will be aged 3 by 31st December 2023, they will be eligible for a place.

Bad Weather Conditions

Should the weather be severe at any point through winter, we will let you know of any closures through Arbor communications.

As we are entering the winter months, I wanted to make you aware of the arrangements for if we are unable to open as a result of weather conditions. We will only do this as a last resort where we think there is a risk to the safety of pupils and staff. We have some staff who travel a long way and at times it may be unsafe for them to do so.

Please also be aware that as the snow often arrives between 7am and 9am, we may be in a position to open later in the morning when the air begins to warm slightly.

If we do need to close, this is what we will do:

- We will make you aware as soon we can via Arbor, the school website and Twitter (X).
- Work will be sent out for the children to complete by 10.30am. This will be sent via Arbor.



What is happening in the classroom?

Nursery

This week, Nursery have been introduced to their first Bible story; Noah's Ark. We have listened to the story, learnt a song about the animals and played matching games to find the pairs of animals to board the boat. We even had a go at writing parts of the story using our pre-writing mark making skills.

The children have been learning about routine this week and have had fun talking about what we do in the daytime and what we do at night time. We then used our sequencing and ordering skills to order events and numbers. What comes first, what comes next, what comes last?

Our new sensory and calm down room is also now open and the children have enjoyed using the soft play that has been kindly donated by one of our parents! The children love it, Thank you!

Reception

RG

This week RG have been learning about people who help us such as a doctor, police officer and a firefighter. In Maths RG have been learning to identify more than and fewer than.

RS

This week RS have loved using their gross motor skills to build a range of things in the outdoor area. We have seen, dens, garages, rockets and cars being built from a range of different resources. It is fantastic to see such great imagination!

In literacy we have started to plan and write our story about a superhero called Joop who is looking for a sidekick. The children have been using ther phonic knowledge and applying this to their writing.

1F

In art this week the children used lines to create an underwater picture. They then used a range of colours and materials to make their pictures stand out. In English the children have worked very hard by planning and writing their build up, problem and ending to their own story. The children have enjoyed their music lesson this week where they learned a new song called sparkle. They practiced the song before performing it as a whole class.

1M

This week, in Year 1, the children achieved a goal in PSHE. They worked with a partner to design a wellie that was identical. They had to use skills such as listening to their partner, taking it in turns and talking to one another. We also have enjoyed Science this week as the children looked at different properties of everyday materials. In Art the children created a under water picture using different materials and exploring the different lines we have learnt about.

2K

In 2K we have been learning about Money this week. We have been looking at different coins and notes and how to make different amounts. In writing we have been writing our story about finding an unusual creature. We also visited the mosque this week. We had a lovely time learning all about Islam and parts of a mosque.

2R

In 2R we have been working really hard on our story writing in English. The work the children have produced is amazing and they should all be so proud. We have also been working really hard in Maths in our topic about Money. This is definitely a hard topic but the children are doing amazing. Well done for such hard work this week 2R keep up the good work.

Year 3

3D

This week in English, the children have been writing their own setting narrative, using their plan about a river's journey. They have been using different writing techniques such as personification, prepositions, expanded noun phrases and many more. In French, the children have been learning how to count to 20 and different animals.

3T

This week, we have written our own setting narrative about a river's journey. I was amazed by all of the writing in 3T, they included prepositions, personification, expanded noun phrases, conjunctions and so much more! They should be really proud of themselves!

In Geography, we looked at lines of longitude and what countries they pass through using an atlas.

In Science, we looked at different forces and which everyday objects would be a push force and which would be a pull force.

Year 4

4J

Children had a wonderful visit to the Gurdwara in Smethwick where children learnt about the Sikh faith in great detail. This visit will support learning within their RE lessons this half term. During Art this week, children have been exploring geometric patterns using compasses. 4J have focused on their narrative writing skills this week, using the skills they have learnt over two weeks into their own independent writing.

We then used the knowledge we learned for this trip and applied it to our RE lessons. We had an Art day this week where 4R learned all about geometric shapes and patters and created their own prints. In writing, we have been completing our Mythical narrative using all the skills and knowledge they have learned over the past two weeks.



What you need to bring to school

A reminder of what to bring to school:

✓ A water bottle (please make sure it has yourname on it). This should only have water in it and have a pop up top (not a screw top as if these fall over on the desks, they will ruin the children's work).

✓ A school bag or bookbag.

- √ A healthy fruit snack for breaktime (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with this).
- \checkmark You can bring your scooter or bike to school if you wish. Please remember to wear a helmet and not to ride them whilst on school grounds.

X As always, please remember not to bring in any toys or stationery from home, unless it has been specifically requested by your teacher.

X No non-prescribed medication. Any medication that has been prescribed must be handed by the parent/carer to the school office staff who will ask you to complete a medication form detailing-permission and dosage.

Medical and Dietary Information

It is very important that we have up-to-date medical information including new Care Plans so we will be sending these out for you to review, complete and return. Any other updated health information should be sent in via the school office.

Please remember to inform the school of any changes to your child's medical or dietary needs.

Please also ensure that any prescribed medication, including an inhaler or EpiPen, is in-date and in school
- it is parents responsibility to ensure this.

Free School Meals, Toast and Price Changes

All children in Year's Reception - Year 2 are entitled to a 'Universal Free School Meal'.

When a child enters Year 3 this entitlement ends. If you would like your child to receive a school dinner your will need to:

- Check you eligibility for a FSM here: <u>Online FSM Application (cloudforedu.org.uk)</u> School will be notified of the outcome of your application and proceed accordingly.
- Top up your 'School Food United' account to ensure there are funds to pay for your child's meals.

 The price for a school meal for the academic year 23/24 is £2.80 per day. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.
 - We will no longer be accepting cash for toast, this will also need to be ordered each down through 'School Food United' The cost per day is 25p. Children will receive their toast at their break time between around 10.30am. Remember that these need to be ordered by **8.30 am** each day.

• We sent out guidance of how to create/use your 'School Food United' app via Arbor last week - if you require any further assistance please speak to a member of the school office.

Birthdays

Natasha's Law came into effect on 1st October 2021. We appreciate that there may be some special times throughout the year when children may wish to bring sweets or chocolate in to share with their friends (e.g birthdays), please may we ask that children only bring in prepacked sweets such as Haribos which can then be handed out at the end of the day before children go and see their parents or guardians. Please understand that we cannot accept any homemade or individual sweets as this will not comply with Natasha's Law or current allergen requirements.

Nut Free School

A reminder that the school is a nut-free zone as several children and members of staff have severe nut allergies. Please make sure that no nuts are brought to school and please check the ingredients on packets carefully. Thank you for helping us to keep all our community safe.

- Red sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without logo).
 - Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore.
 - Red and white check dress (summer).
 - Grey or black shorts (summer).
 - Black shoes.





P.E Uniform

- Red or black shorts.
- White t-shirt (with or without the school logo).
 - Black bumps/trainers.
- Black tracksuit bottoms for outdoor games in winter.

Pumps are needed for indoor PE and must come in a separate bag for children to change into for the lesson. Trainers are not to be worn inside. Please make sure that your child has a pair of pumps onsite in case the weather means we need to do P.E inside.

You can also purchase a hoodie with the school logo on for P.E. from the office. This is not compulsory.
